Prayer: Declaratory and Injunctive Relief 12 Fee Authority: ORS 21.135(1), (2)(a), (f) 13 Plaintiff Energy Policy Advocates, a Washington Nonprofit Corporation, by and through 14 its attorney, Shawn M. Lindsay, brings this complaint against Ellen Rosenblum, in her official 15 capacity as the Attorney General for the State of Oregon, and the Oregon Department of Justice 16 ("Department of Justice"), and in support thereof avers as follows: 17 18 1. This is an action for declaratory and injunctive relief under the Oregon Public Records 19 Law, Or. Rev. Stat. ("ORS") §§ 192.311 et seq., to enforce the right to inspect certain public 20 21 records in the custody of the Department of Justice. 2. 22 The Department of Justice is the main legal branch of the government of the State of 23 Oregon. The Department of Justice is the legal and physical custodian of the records at issue in 24 25 this lawsuit and is the "public body" within the meaning of the Oregon Public Records Law, ORS 192.311(4), and is required under ORS 192.314(1) to make available for public inspection "any 26

public record of a public body in this state, except as otherwise expressly provided by ORS 192.338 [Exempt and nonexempt public record to be separated], 192.345 [Public records conditionally exempt from disclosure] and 192.355 [Public records exempt from disclosure]." Attorney General Rosenblum is the head of the Department of Justice. ORS 180.210.

3.

Energy Policy Advocates requested, in three separate Public Records Law requests, copies of Department of Justice correspondence with former U.S. Environmental Protection Agency officials. These outside, private parties are largely now regulatory policy activists and were expressly referred by another outside activist to attorneys general offices (AGO), in response to one AGO's request for names of "EPN folks." "EPN folks" referred to a "501(c)(3)" policy group calling itself "Environmental Protection Network," launched "to harness the expertise of former EPA career staff and confirmation-level appointees." All of these parties volunteered to help promote a particular national regulatory agenda, including through pressure brought by state attorneys general offices.

4.

The first request, submitted on July 7, 2020, requested copies of five categories of records over various short, specified periods of time including certain described correspondence over a two week period in December 2019, and any attachments, that was sent to or from or which copied Department of Justice official² Steve Novick and/or Department of Justice employee Emma Borg; certain described other correspondence over a two and a half month period in November 2019 through January 2020, that was sent to or from or copied Mr. Novick and/or Ms. Borg; certain described call-scheduling invitations sent to or from Mr. Novick and/or Ms. Borg dated from

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November 18, 2019, through January 30, 2020; and calendars of Paul Garrahan and Steven Novick dated November 18 through January 30, 2020. (Ex. 1).³

5.

The second request, submitted July 14, 2020, requested copies of four categories of records over particular, specified periods of time including certain described correspondence, and any attachments, dated December 3, 2019, through January 30, 2020, sent to or from or copying Messrs. Novick or Paul Garrahan, and/or Emma Borg, that was also sent to or from or copied parties "Bachmann," "Ketcham-Colwill," and/or "Schneeberg;" also, any agreement(s) entered into or in effect between the Department of Justice and John Bachmann, Jim Ketcham-Colwill, Nancy Ketcham-Colwill and/or Sarah Schneeberg Robinson at any time in 2019 or 2020. (Ex. 2). Plaintiff also narrowed this request, later seeking those records excluded by that narrowing in its third request at issue here, sent on September 23, 2020, and described, *infra*.

6.

The requested records are of great public interest. They reflect efforts by the Department of Justice to enlist outside advocates in a campaign to impose an activist federal regulatory agenda.

7.

The Department of Justice acknowledged receipt of the requests on July 17, 2020, combining them on the grounds of significant overlap in records responsive to the requests' "correspondence" subsections, stating it had "located approximately 50 emails responsive to these requests." Defendants stated there were no agreements between the Department of Justice and the four named parties named in the July 14, 2020, request (subsections 2-4). The Department of Justice initially sought a fee of \$262.00 for retrieval and review of records, though this was lowered to \$154.75 after Plaintiff narrowed the request⁴, after which Defendants stated "reduce[d] the number of emails requiring review to about 20." Plaintiff mailed a check for the fee.

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On August 4, 2020, the Department of Justice provided redacted copies of Mr. Garrahan's official calendar for the requested dates, stating in pertinent part, "[i]nformation redacted on the last page is exempt from disclosure under ORS 192.345(1) (pertaining to litigation)." (Ex. 3).

9.

On September 2, 2020, the Department of Justice provided redacted copies of Mr. Novick's official calendar for the requested dates, stating in pertinent part, "[i]nformation that is redacted was determined to be exempt under ORS 192.345(1) (pertaining to litigation) and 192.345(22) (security codes)." (Ex. 4).

10.

On September 16, 2020, the Department of Justice provided the final installment of responsive records, correspondence between one Department of Justice official (Mr. Novick) and anywhere from one to three (of four total) different outside activists, with redactions, stating in pertinent part, "[i]nformation redacted from the emails was determined to be exempt under ORS 192.345(1) (pertaining to litigation)." (Ex. 5). Of the original "approximately 50" records, narrowed to "about 20" emails, Defendants produced 16 emails. Defendant confirmed no records were withheld in full on September 16, 2020, however, Plaintiff is in possession of at least one responsive email referenced in those records that were produced, but which itself was not produced.

11.

Plaintiff then submitted its third of the requests at issue on September 29, 2020, seeking the remaining "roughly 30 emails that we [Defendants] did not review that were responsive to your original Jul[y] 14 request." (Department of Justice's Andrew Foltz to Plaintiff counsel Neal Cornett, September 29, 2020). That is, those dated December 3, 2019, through January 30, 2020, that was sent to or from or copying Mr. Novick and otherwise included, anywhere, the search terms "Bachmann," "Ketcham-Colwill," and/or "Schneeberg." On September 29, 2020, Mr. Foltz

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estimated "one hour of attorney review" to process this request at a cost to Plaintiff of \$143, noting that Plaintiff had a credit of prior payments not refunded that was greater than that amount, and asked if Plaintiff would like to apply that credit to that cost. Plaintiff agreed.

12.

On October 16, 2020, the Department of Justice provided its response, withholding 29 emails responsive to the request as exempt in their entirety under ORS 192.345(1) and/or ORS 192.355(9)(a) which incorporates ORS 40.255 (lawyer-client privilege, including the common interest privilege).

13.

In the responses described herein withholding and denying Plaintiff access to requested public information, Attorney General Rosenblum, as head of the Department of Justice, relies on the conditional exemption in ORS 192.345 allowing agencies to withhold information pertaining to litigation absent a public interest requiring disclosure and the lawyer-client privilege, including the common interest privilege, incorporated by 192.355(9)(a).

14.

These redactions in emails exchanging thoughts with various former U.S. EPA attorneys on the aforementioned policy campaign include, *inter alia*, apparent withholdings of discussion, volunteered by these activists, of actress Jane Fonda getting arrested protesting in favor of the desired policy agenda; discussion in that same context of a rumored future Environmental Protection Agency Administrator; the descriptive part of emails' Subject field; at least one exchange in substantive full; and ten pages redacted in full. (*See* Ex. 5).

15.

The information, from its context, is not legitimately exempt from the Public Records Law and the Defendants have demonstrated no countervailing interest to outweigh the public interest in releasing information relating to Department of Justice solicitation from private activists about possible campaigns to impose a sweeping regulatory shift; Defendants have not demonstrated the

This Court is required to review the Attorney General and/or the Department of Justice's response under the Oregon Public Records Law *de novo*. ORS 192.431(1), which provides, in pertinent part, "The court shall determine the matter de novo and the burden is on the public body to sustain its action. The court, on its own motion, may view the documents in controversy in camera before reaching a decision."

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

26.

The requested records are public records within the meaning of the Oregon Public Records Law, ORS 192.311(5), and contain information that is not exempt from disclosure. The requested information is not exempt from inspection as the public interest demands the release of information evidencing coordination of the Attorney General and Department of Justice with outside advocates, with whom the Department of Justice has no privilege but only an ideological alignment, theorizing on the advancement of a particular, federal regulatory scheme and otherwise engaging in non-exempt discussion of personalities and events. Further, the Defendants have not met the burden of establishing that the redacted and withheld records pertain to any litigation currently ongoing or reasonably likely to occur as established in ORS 192.345(1) or that release is contrary to the public interest; nor have they established that the redacted and withheld records are subject to the lawyer-client privilege incorporated by ORS 192.355(9)(a).

27.

Any person has a right to inspect public records of public bodies in the state unless the records are expressly exempted from disclosure. ORS 192.314; *In Def. of Animals v. Oregon Health Sciences Univ.*, 199 Or. App. 160, 168 (2005).

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The custodian of a public record must provide a person who asks to inspect a record a "reasonable opportunit[y]" to inspect or copy it, ORS 192.318(1) and 192.324(1)(b), barring satisfaction of its burden to establish exemption of the withheld information.

29.

Defendants' response does not satisfy the statutory requirements but instead provides a conclusory justification for redacting public records.

FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF Duty to Produce Records – Oregon Public Records Law Declaratory Judgment

30.

Plaintiff re-alleges paragraphs 1-29 as if fully set out herein.

31.

Plaintiff is entitled to records subject only to legitimate withholding.

32.

Plaintiff has no requirement to further pursue its administrative remedies.

33.

Plaintiff asks this Court to enter a judgment declaring that:

- a. The information requested in the July 7 & 14, 2020, and September 23, 2020, requests are agency records subject to the Oregon Public Records Law;
- b. The withheld, requested information is not exempt under ORS 192.345(1) as it is in the public interest to release the records and Defendants have not demonstrated any litigation ongoing or reasonably likely to occur or that the withheld information is privileged on those or other grounds;
- c. The withheld, requested information is not exempt under ORS 192.355(9)(a) as it does not meet the requirements of ORS 40.255 to be protected confidential communications;
 - d. Defendants' refusal to provide responsive records is unlawful; and

On behalf of Energy Policy Advocates (EPA), recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit public policy institute under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and pursuant to the Oregon Public Records Law, ORS 192.311, et seq., please provide copies of the following records:

1. all electronic correspondence, and any accompanying information (see discussion of SEC Data Delivery Standards, *infra*), including also any attachments, a) sent to or from or copying (whether as cc: or bcc:) i) Paul Garrahan, ii) Steve Novick, and/or iii) Emma Borg that, b) includes "Fwd: Draft note" in the subject field, and c) is dated from December 3, 2019 through December 17, 2019, inclusive; and

2. all electronic correspondence, and any accompanying information (see discussion of SEC Data Delivery Standards, *infra*), including also any attachments, a) sent to or from or copying (whether as cc: or bcc:) i) Paul Garrahan, ii) Steve Novick, and/or iii) Emma Borg that, b) was also sent to or from or copies Nancy Ketcham-Colwill, and c) is dated from November 18, 2019 through January 30, 2020, inclusive; and

- 3. all electronic correspondence, and any accompanying information (see discussion of SEC Data Delivery Standards, *infra*), including also any attachments, a) sent to or from or copying (whether as cc: or bcc:) i) Paul Garrahan, ii) Steve Novick, and/or iii) Emma Borg that, b) was also sent to or from or copies Sara Schneeberg Robinson, and c) is dated from November 18, 2019 through January 30, 2020, inclusive; and
- **4.** all scheduling invitations for calls a) sent to or from i) Paul Garrahan, ii) Steve Novick, and/or iii) Emma Borg that, b) were also sent to or from Nancy Ketcham-Colwill, and c) are dated from November 18, 2019 through January 30, 2020, inclusive; and
- 5. calendars of i) Paul Garrahan and ii) Steve Novick dated from November 18, 2019 through January 30, 2020, inclusive.

Regarding #1-4 of this request, we request entire "threads" of which any responsive electronic correspondence is a part, regardless whether any portion falls outside of the above time parameter.

Also regarding parts #1-4 of this request, please consider as non-responsive electronic correspondence that merely receives or forwards newsletters or press summaries or 'clippings', such as news services or stories or opinion pieces, if that correspondence has no comment or no substantive comment added by a party other than the original sender in the thread (an electronic mail message that includes any expression of opinion or viewpoint would be considered as including substantive comment; examples of non-responsive emails would be those forwarding a news report or opinion piece with no comment or only "fyi", or "interesting").

Additionally, please consider all published or docketed materials, including pleadings, regulatory comments, ECF notices, news articles, and/or newsletters, as non-responsive, unless forwarded to or from the named persons with substantive commentary added by the sender.

We understand that in some instances a public body may charge a fee for the cost of the search, examination, review, copying, separation of confidential from nonconfidential information, and mailing costs. If your Office expects to seek a charge associated with the searching, copying or production of these records, please provide an estimate of anticipated costs.

As noted earlier in this request, EPA is a non-profit public policy organization dedicated to informing the public of developments in the area of energy and environmental issues and relationships between governmental and non-governmental entities as they relate to those issues. EPA's ability to obtain fee waivers is essential to this work. EPA intends to use any responsive information to continue its work highlighting the nexus between interested non-governmental entities and government agency decision-making. The public is both interested in and entitled to know how regulatory, policy and enforcement decisions are reached. EPA ensures the public is made aware of its work and findings via its partnership with the non-profit public interest law firm Government Accountability & Oversight, P.C., and the ClimateLitigationWatch.org project dedicated to broadly disseminating energy and environmental policy news and developments.

The public information obtained by EPA and published on ClimateLitigationWatch.org have

been relied upon by established media outlets, including the Washington Times and Wall Street Journal editorial page.¹

Energy Policy Advocates requests records on your system, e.g., its backend logs, and does not seek only those records which survive on an employee's own machine or account. We do not demand your office produce requested information in any particular form, instead we request records in their native form, with specific reference to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission Data Delivery Standards.² The covered information we seek is electronic information, this includes electronic *records*, and other public *information*.

To quote the SEC Data Delivery Standards, "Electronic files must be produced in their native format, i.e. the format in which they are ordinarily used and maintained during the normal course of business. For example, an MS Excel file must be produced as an MS Excel file rather than an image of a spreadsheet. (Note: An Adobe PDF file is not considered a native file unless the document was initially created as a PDF.)" (emphases in original).

In many native-format productions, certain public information remains contained in the record (e.g., metadata). Under the same standards, to ensure production of all information

requested, if your production will be de-duplicated it is vital that you 1) preserve any unique

metadata associated with the duplicate files, for example, custodian name, and, 2) make that

unique metadata part of your production.

Native file productions may be produced without load files. However, native file

productions must maintain the integrity of the original meta data, and must be produced as they

are maintained in the normal course of business and organized by custodian-named file folders. A

separate folder should be provided for each custodian.

In the event that necessity requires your office to produce a PDF file, due to your normal

program for redacting certain information and such that native files cannot be produced as they

are maintained in the normal course of business, in order to provide all requested information

each PDF file should be produced in separate folders named by the custodian, and accompanied

by a load file to ensure the requested information appropriate for that discrete record is

associated with that record. The required fields and format of the data to be provided within the

load file can be found in Addendum A of the above-cited SEC Data Standards. All produced

PDFs must be text searchable.

Exchange Commission Data Delivery Standards.² The covered information we seek is electronic information, this includes electronic *records*, and other public *information*.

To quote the SEC Data Delivery Standards, "Electronic files must be produced in their native format, i.e. the format in which they are ordinarily used and maintained during the normal course of business. For example, an MS Excel file must be produced as an MS Excel file rather than an image of a spreadsheet. (Note: An Adobe PDF file is not considered a native file unless the document was initially created as a PDF.)" (emphases in original).

In many native-format productions, certain public information remains contained in the record (e.g., metadata). Under the same standards, to ensure production of all information requested, if your production will be de-duplicated it is vital that you 1) preserve any unique metadata associated with the duplicate files, for example, custodian name, and, 2) make that unique metadata part of your production.

Native file productions may be produced without load files. However, native file productions must maintain the integrity of the original meta data, and must be produced as they are maintained in the normal course of business and organized by custodian-named file folders. associated with that record. The required fields and format of the data to be provided within the load file can be found in Addendum A of the above-cited SEC Data Standards. All produced PDFs must be text searchable.
