This is a heads up that early next week, we plan to submit into expedited clearance the unwinding SHO. I am still finalizing a timeline with OSORA, but we are targeting a 1/24 rollout, with an EOP R1 with a 48-hour turnaround, and an EOP R2 with a 24-hour showstopper only turnaround. We appreciate, in advance, you working with us on such tight timelines.

As soon as I have a final timeline early next week, I will share it with you both so you know when to expect the SHO draft

As you may have seen, California posted a new draft 1115 application for state public comment today: <a href="https://www.dhcs.ca.gov/provgovpart/Documents/CalRHAD-Draft-Application-for-Public-Comment.pdf">https://www.dhcs.ca.gov/provgovpart/Documents/CalRHAD-Draft-Application-for-Public-Comment.pdf</a>

As noted in the draft, CA is requesting expenditure authority to provide grants to reproductive health providers for enhancing capacity and access to sexual and reproductive health services "for the benefit of individuals enrolled in Medi-Cal and other individuals who currently face barriers to access." To be eligible for the grants, providers must meet all of the following criteria:

- o Are located in California and licensed under applicable California law;
- o Provide a broad spectrum of sexual and reproductive health care services;
- o Serve a minimum volume of individuals enrolled in Medi-Cal; and
- o Accept patients regardless of ability to pay.

The state also proposes to prioritize grant awards to applying providers located in areas with documented reproductive health provider shortages and access challenges, including rural geographies or medically underserved areas, among others.


Hi folks,

Quick follow-up answers to our OTC naloxone call just now --

- States can choose, but are not required, to cover OTC products. PR just joined MDRP in Jan 2023 so need to
  confirm where they are on this, but all other programs except Florida (see below) have an OTC coverage of some
  sort. What it will take for each state to cover OTC naloxone may look different but unlikely to require legislative
  changes in most cases
  - FL, as of about 2 months, has legislation that prohibits coverage of OTC products through Medicaid. Our
    Div of Pharmacy team has alerted their team about the potential challenge, and the FL team is having
    internal discussions to see how they can adjust
  - Covering OTC products needs to be reflected in the Medicaid State Plan and some states may need to submit SPAs to change their OTC coverage. Our Pharmacy team is counselling states on SPA language to be inclusive of other potential OTC products (e.g., OCPs that may get FDA approval later this year).
- States <u>can</u> collect rebates on OTC products if the manufacturer participates in MDRP and there's a 'prescription'
  / standing order to treat the OTC as an 'Rx' product (based on the overarching requirement for a clinician to
  request the benefit/service). The magnitude of rebate on an OTC product is based on average manufacturer
  price (AMP). A state's decision to cover a new OTC naloxone product will likely be based on net/net price,
  inclusive of federal and supplemental rebates.


